PROTEST : PEACEFUL OR VIOLENT METHODS?

Assembly Plan

AIM

To consider the reasons for Martin Luther King Day and introduce his message/dream of making progress in civil rights for Blacks through peaceful protest.

STRUCTURE

1. INTRODUCTION

This assembly is about Martin Luther King. He dedicated his life to fighting against racism and discrimination.

Have you ever felt really strongly about something enough to make you want to protest?

What different ways can people protest?

Is one method more effective?

Martin Luther King spoke to many people, Black and White, Latin Americans, Asians, every kind of person. He taught them to stand up and say that the laws were wrong. Emphasize the importance that he used words and peaceful methods to change things.

2. POWERPOINT

Martin Luther King became a campaigner for civil rights for Blacks, and a champion of human rights. In America, Martin Luther King's tireless campaigning raised awareness of the unfair way Black people were treated, and his actions brought about change.
